Taken 2015-06-16 (Translation of Dnr. KS 59-2015/312)

Teaching and learning in higher education – continuing professional development for doctoral students

Education in teaching and learning in higher education forms part of the continuing professional development required for doctoral students to work as teachers in their department. The decision has been taken that all doctoral students who are employed at a department within the Faculty of Culture and Society shall be enabled to attend one of the following courses in teaching and learning in higher education as part of their continuing professional development: Academic Teaching, basic course (5 credits), Working as a University Teacher, summer course (5 credits), Supporting the Learning of Others, third-cycle course (5 credits), or some other prospective course by another name but containing the equivalent scope and content.

A successfully completed course is credited as being part of departmental duties and is compensated for by 140 hours on the doctoral student's duty card.

Application for attending the course follows the usual procedure of being submitted to AKL, the Centre for Academic Leadership. The Head of the Department in question (or the equivalent person) has to be informed simultaneously.

For those who choose to attend the course for credits in their third-cycle programme, no hours for continuing professional development will be granted.

This decision has been taken by Ingrid Dackert, Dean of the Faculty of Culture and Society, after preparation in the Faculty Management Group and in the presence of Fredrik Lindström, Director of Studies for third-cycle programmes at the faculty.

The decision replaces the old decision on teaching and learning in higher education for doctoral students from December 12, 2011 (Reference number KS 69-2011/1788). The decision applies as from the 1 June 2015.
